Historical Data:

Mr. Middleton died in 1784 leaving his wife with only one child, a son. She owned in Ansonboro, a lot conveyed to her father in April 1770; to this, she added in 1796, a lot to the west and upon these two lots she began to build the imposing house still standing but now occupied by the Water Works Company.

In 1797, she married Major (later Major General) Thomas Pinckney and together they completed the house at a cost of about \$50,000.

On February 25, 1822, General and Mrs. Pinckney conveyed it to her son, John Middleton for \$10,000 in cash. In 1826, the property was transferred to Mrs. Juliet Georgiana Elliott. The house remained in the Elliott family until 1879, when it was sold to Jesse W. Stair, Jr. from whom it passed to the Water Company.
