Additional Data One of the most ambitious plantation homes in this section. Originally there were two unequal one-story flanking wings that projected on each side of the main mass of the house. One wing, the smaller, contained the plantation office, and the other (larger) wing was perhaps a drawing room. These two wings have been detached from the house and are now used as tenant houses. The unusually large windows, characteristic of this section are found here. The superimposed 4-columned porch with pediment is unusually well done. There are still traces of a formal garden.
