FORT HILL FARM, South Shed

HABS NO. VA-1288-H

- LOCATION: West of the Staunton (Roanoke) River between Turkey Run and Caesar's Run, Clover Vicinity, Halifax County, Virginia
- SIGNIFICANCE: This shed is a contributing element of Fort Hill Farm.
- DESCRIPTION: This 8' x 8' shed is located a short distance to the south of the north shed (HABS No. VA-1288-G). It is a one-room, front-gable, clapboarded building of stud construction with circular-sawn, dimensional lumber fastened with wire nails. It rests on a concrete block foundation, and is covered with a galvanized, corrugated seam roof. The entrance is centered in the east wall and a small window opening is in the south wall. The shed is painted white and has a dirt floor.
- HISTORY: The construction date of this shed is unknown. Slender poles resting on ceiling joists may have been used for tobacco storage.
