**SAMUEL JACKSON TO JACKSON.**

[n. p.] February 13, 1807.

*Sir.* I received your note and have to observe that I am willing to deliver the Negro Woman at the five hundred dollrs and will settle your Accot deduction first fifty dollrs which I do not own, but if I dont pay, Jas and Washington Jackson the fifty dollrs, then I will pay the Amot of your Accot out of the Negro Woman, and you Can have his when ever your Boat is ready. I would like to keep her as long as it was in your power to do without her, as we have but little help.<sup>1</sup> I am ready to deliver great part of the Cotton note to Colo Hays and am Sir
