MUST HAVE OUR ELECTORS.

Republican Observers in Other States Fear the Loss of the Presidency.

Platt and the Bliss Factions Are Looked Upon More Seriously Elsewhere Than Here.

ILLINOIS DELEGATES AND MORTON.

A Probable Arrangement Whereby Shelby M. Cullom May Receive the Support of This State for the Vice-Presidency.

Letters have been received during the last few days from Republican leaders outside of this State asking New York leaders if the wrangling now going on in the Republican camp in this city was not injuring Governor Morton's chances for the Presidency, and if the Republicans in this city were not aware that they were endangering party success at the next election.

These letters have been received by the directors of both factions from the managers of several Presidential candidates and national committees, who have become alarmed over the seeming break-up of the party in this State. They look upon the fight here as a more serious thing than it is considered at home.

The Morton managers do not hope to get any votes from Illinois on the first ballot, as the delegation will probably be divided between Reed and McKinley on the first ballot, unless it is decided to give Senator Cullom a complimentary vote. After the first ballot, the party will be divided into three camps, the McKinley, the Cullom, and the Morton camps. It is thought that the McKinley camp will be the largest, and that the Morton camp will be the smallest.
