Medical Staff of Willard Parker Hospital Divided as to the Wisdom of Using It. Dr. Winters Says There Have Been Deaths That Can Be Attributed Only to Anti-Toxine.

NEVER KNEW IT TO BE BENEFICIAL.

Dr. Brannin, of the Other Faction, Declares That Many Patients Have Been Saved by It—Statistics Supporting His Position.

There is a difference of opinion among the doctors comprising the medical staff of the Willard Parker Hospital, at Sixteenth street and the East River, that has become decidedly pronounced. The subject of contention is the use of anti-toxine for the cure of diphtheria.

The members of the board who are opposed to its use are so inflexible in their position that they propose to have no stone thrown to secure its adoption. The Medical Board of this hospital, which is for the treatment of infectious diseases, consists of Dr. Brannin, Dr. Henry M. Berg, Dr. Joseph E. Winters, Dr. William P. Northrup, Dr. Albert T. Swan, Dr. Herman M. Biggs, Dr. Charles S. Benedict and Dr. William H. Park.
