

A LITTLE DISPUTE OVER A CHILD. It is Alleged Miss Mathews Pushed Miss Platt and Flew with the Girl. The Child is the Daughter of Miss Platt's Brother and Miss Mathews's Sister. PARENTS SEPARATED A YEAR AGO. Since Then Emily Has Lived with Her Father, and Her Mother Was Anxious to Obtain Possession of Her—The Young Women in Court.

Miss Jennie Mathews, a stylishly dressed, handsome woman, twenty-two years of age, was a striking figure as she stood in a crowd of spectators who filled the Long Island City Police Court yesterday morning. Miss Mathews, whose family is one of the best known in Red Bank, N. J., had appeared before Justice Ingram in answer to a summons issued at the instance of Miss Phoebe Platt, her sister-in-law, who resides at No. 152 Flushing avenue, Astoria, L. I. Miss Platt charged her with attacking her in her own home Thursday morning. There were present in court with Miss Mathews her mother and some friends from Red Bank, and on the other side were a complainant and her brother, Arnold Platt. The story related to Justice Ingram by Miss Platt was that on Thursday morning she received a visit from Miss Jennie Mathews, who is the sister of her brother Arnold's wife. The latter's three-year-old daughter, Emily, had been living with Miss Platt and her brother since Arnold and his wife separated, about a year ago. Miss Platt had occasion to look after some household duties and left little Emily with Miss Mathews. Soon afterward as she was returning she met Miss Mathews and Emily, at the head of the hall stairway. She asked Miss Mathews where she was going with Emily, and the young girl replied: "I'm going to take her to her brother at Red Bank. Miss Platt told her she could not take the little girl, and attempted to prevent her descending the stairs. Then she called Arnold Platt, and pushed her roughly, causing her to fall to the bottom of the stairway and dislocate her arm. Miss Mathews hurried out of the house, carrying Emily in her arms, and boarded a trolley car going in the direction of the Thirty-fourth street ferry. She had not seen her sister-in-law since that time, and her brother, who is a printer in New York, and who immediately went to Astoria and returned to her to Justice Ingram's Court to secure the summons for Miss Mathews.

When the case was called Justice Ingram asked Miss Mathews what she had done with the child Emily. She said she did not at present know her whereabouts. Miss Platt was told that she had to have Miss Mathews and compel her to return little Emily, but she said he could do nothing unless a formal complaint charging Miss Mathews with kidnapping were lodged upon which he could issue a warrant for her arrest. He also suggested that Miss Platt make a charge of assault, but for some unascertained reason no formal charges were preferred to the Court, and all the parties concerned left the court room.

Miss Mathews returned to New Jersey and the Platts to their home. Mr. Platt was going to New York to try to recover possession of his daughter. Arnold Platt, who is thirty years old, is a son of Edward K. Platt, who for half a century has been ferryman at the Ninety-second street ferry. Five years ago he spent the summer in Red Bank, when he met and loved Miss Emily Mathews, then one of the belles of the village. A year later they were married at the home of Emily's parents, the wedding being one of the principal social events of the season.

The Platts lived happily together, with their little daughter, until about a year ago, when Mrs. Platt's mind became affected, and she was removed to an asylum, which she has been in for several months. The expiration of which time she was suddenly recovered to be removed to her father's home at Red Bank.

When his wife was placed in the asylum Platt took his daughter and went to live with her mother. Mrs. Platt, it is said, has made many requests to have the child sent to her, but her husband has persistently refused to allow her to go. It is believed that little Emily, now with her mother, and as she is not within the jurisdiction of the New York authorities she is likely to remain there for some time.
