WHY SHOULD DOMINICK HAVE DIED?

BORN-In Central Park, Monday, March 20, to Mr. Tom and Mrs. Fannie Zeln, a daughter. Little Miss March is the latest addition to the Zoo in Central Park.

Miss March, as the new arrival has been named by Keeper Holmes on account of the month in which she was born, is an unusually healthy animal and has already shown evidence of much intelligence.

Miss March is the best-formed calf ever born in Central Park. All her immediate ancestors were born in the Park, the first of the breed being brought to this city in 1809 from India by a native known as "Big Tom."

A DEATH AS WELL AS A BIRTH. The brightest which the advent of Miss March brought to the Zoo yesterday was somewhat clouded by the death of Dominick, a Brazilian parrot.

The parrot was brought to this country ten years ago, when a young bird, and was purchased by Charles Martin, who at that time had a prosperous business at No. 75 Third street.

A year ago bird times came to the Martins, and they finally lost all their savings. Mrs. Martin became sick and died last December. Martin himself was in poor health and unable to work.

On February 27 he took the parrot, carefully wrapped in a blanket, to the Park, and told his story. As a result Dominick was installed in one of the largest cages in the aviary.

DELICACIES FOR THE TABLE. Game More Plentiful and Cheaper—Poultry Still in Light Supply.

At the poultry and game stalls in the market yesterday an advance was asked for grouse, owing to extreme scarcity; considerable inquiry was made for plump birds, but little business was done on account of the high price—\$2 per pair.

The Spring ducks in the market at the moment are poor, but listed at 35 cents per pound. Choice fresh, heavy birds are expected to be on sale in a month's time and will probably sell much cheaper.

All kinds of ducks have been marked down and are selling readily; canvasbacks are worth \$4 a pair, teal \$3, mallards and black ducks \$1.25, and common ducks \$1 per pair.
