

THREE WHEELS BACK FOR HIDDEN BOOT.

Had Looted Two Houses and Carried Away Much Plunder on a Bicycle.

Policeman Found His Cache of the Remains, Watched and Captured the Burglar.

DRESSED IN ATTIRE HE STOLE. Refused to Give His Name or His Residence and Was Entered on Court Records as "John Doe of, Anywhere."

Because of his avarice a Brooklyn thief, who is believed to have carried away his booty on a bicycle, fell into a trap laid for him by Captain Early, of the Gates Avenue Station House. He is now in Raymond Street Jail, held in \$1,000 bail for trial under the name of John Doe. The police regard him as a clever burglar and because of his peculiar capture they modestly consider themselves very clever officials.

The houses robbed were occupied by James Campbell, at No. 974 Gates avenue and James H. Drysdale, at No. 480 Monroe street. The dwellings are big and handsome, with lawns and flower gardens, and adjoining rear yards surrounded with grape arbors. The fact that the Campbell and Drysdale families had been robbed was discovered Tuesday morning. It was apparent that the burglar had gone into the Campbell residence through a rear basement window, that he had then ransacked the two lower floors, and after trying of that had crossed the two rear yards and entered Drysdale's house.

The property missing was valuable silverware, some jewelry from the Campbell house, table linen from both places and Mr. Drysdale's bicycle, which the thief is believed to have hidden as he carried off his plunder. The load was too much, so he hid some of the silverware, a satchel and a silk umbrella under the grape arbor in the Drysdale yard, where it was found by Patrolman James H. Boyle, of the Gates Avenue Police Station. Boyle joyfully took the goods to the station house and was exhibiting the evidence of his detective ability when it occurred to Captain Early that the thief would come back for the hidden plunder. He had it returned to the hiding place, and Boyle, with a club in one hand, and his revolver in the other, waited on Tuesday night for the return of the thief. The Campbells and the Drysdales kept a lookout, too, and they were rewarded shortly before midnight by the appearance of a man of medium build and stealthy ways, who leaped over the fence and went directly to the place where the stolen articles were hidden. He was arrested by Boyle, and one of Mr. Campbell's handkerchiefs was found in his pocket, and it was discovered that he was wearing an outing shirt of Mr. Drysdale's.

Asked his name, he waved his hand carelessly and said: "I would prefer not to disclose my identity."

"Where do you live?" "I would prefer not to say where I reside," he replied.

He was accordingly called John Doe, and the police are now endeavoring to find out who he is and where he lives.
