

WHEN 137,000 NEW YORK MEN AND WOMEN MARCHED FOR PREPAREDNESS



A section of New York City's Preparedness Parade, 137,000 strong, marching by the Public Library reviewing stand on May 13. 137,000 men and women marched from 9 in the morning until 9 at night to show Congress that they believed in the preparedness that prepares Pennsylvania has 250,000 men and women enlisted for preparedness. It is estimated that 75,000 men will drill this coming summer and fall in citizens' preparedness camps. More than

20,000 citizens have been drilling throughout the year, irrespective of the national guard, and more than 20,000 university and college students are receiving military training. Citizens have vainly asked Congress for officers to instruct them in defence tactics. And Congress has no use for a volunteer army! Congress refuses one cent for training and supporting a volunteer army for use only in time of war!
