


NORTH AND SOUTH EAST AND WEST, THE WAVE



The Members of the First Class, enrolled for two weeks, at the National Service School camp for women at Chevy Chase, Md., just over the border line from Washington. Here, figuratively speaking, almost within sound of the voices of the Congressmen who have refused to provide for a volunteer army, more than 200 women are receiving instruction in First Aid and Red Cross work and Physical Training. Women throughout the country are ably seconding the efforts of their husbands, sons and sweethearts to get by their own effort and with their own money what Congress has refused to give them—training in the defence of their homes. Between 3,000 and 5,000 women marched in New York's Monster Preparedness Parade on May 13. Twenty thousand Pennsylvania women, divided into units, are receiving Red Cross training for sick and wounded, are learning how to teach cripples to earn their living after the French system, and are providing kits for those who go to training camps.



San Francisco Polytechnic High School cadets at target practice in Marin County, Cal. Los Angeles alone has five military schools, with 600 pupils; 10,000 men and boys have had or are having military training in California, exclusive of the National guard. The Columbia Park Boys, 324 strong, have alone given instruction in preliminary military training to 7,000 boys. Here's a roster of part of the public and private school boys who are receiving military training and are ready to receive Federal aid to increase their efficiency: Chattanooga (Tenn.) High School and Tennessee Industrial School, Detroit (Mich.) High School, Omaha High School, Kearny (Neb.) Military Academy, Nebraska Military Academy, Richmond (Va.) High School, five public schools in Providence, R. I., and Minnesota high schools.

The women of Los Angeles and San Francisco are receiving first aid instruction at a camp at Presidio City, Cal. 200 Cleveland women form an auxiliary of the National Guard Training School. Chicago women are taking Red Cross and first aid instruction. 100 St. Louis women are studying military nursing and \$8,000 has been appropriated for a woman's branch of the St. Louis National Security League. 200 Milwaukee women have formed a First Aid Nursing Society.
