Astride the Continental Backbone in the Rocky Mountains, National Estes Park, Colorado.






Inner (granite) Gorge of Colorado River, Grand Canyon of Arizona.


Glacier National Park, Colorado. Sixty glaciers lie in the hollow of its rugged mountain tops.




In Sequoia ("Big Tree") National Park are more than a million huge trees. 12,000 of them from 10 to 35 feet in diameter.
