
HOUSEHOLD AIDS THAT HAVE BEEN TESTED AND ENDORSED



AN ACCURATE SCALE SUITABLE FOR KITCHEN USE.—The Chatillon Red Scale, made by John Chatillon & Sons, 87 Cliff Street, New York, is a spring balance scale approved by the New York City Department of Weights and Measures, and our own testing proves its accuracy in weighing. In the center of the dial is a red disk encircled with a broad white border, on which the ounces and fractional pounds and graduations are clearly defined. The scale is made in a number of styles and ranging from ten to twenty pounds capacity by one-half to one ounce divisions. The pan of the scale illustrated can be turned in a vertical position and hung against the wall when not in use. Price \$2.00 to \$3.00.



AN EFFICIENT POT AND PAN CLEANER.—The Mystic Mit, made by the Mystic Mit Co., 127 Duane St., N. Y., may be mystic in its origin, but is most practical in its usefulness. It will clean anything that is cleanable from pots and kettles to the kitchen table, and is safe on almost any surface except either fine enamel or aluminum. It is simply a pot cleaner made to be slipped over the hand, and its component parts are soft white twine twisted in with fine copper strands and so woven that all the abrasive qualities are on the outside. 


CONVENIENTLY SUPPLIES AN ABUNDANCE OF HOT WATER.—The Holyoke Kerosene Tank Water Heater, made by the Holyoke Heater Company, Holyoke, Mass., can be attached to the ordinary boiler or tank of any circulating water system. It is simple to connect and is especially useful in country houses where gas is not available. Kerosene is the fuel used, and the shell of the heater, the coils and the blue flame burner are assembled in one unit. By accurate test this useful contrivance heated the contents of a thirty gallon boiler to an average temperature of 140 degrees Fahrenheit in two and one-half hours, consuming two-thirds of a pint of oil each hour. This would mean an abundance of hot water for domestic use at a reasonable expense. Price \$20.



PREVENTS OVERCOOKED FOOD OR TARDINESS.—The 24-Hour Wizard Alarm Clock, made by Yankee Wizard Clock Co., 18 Broadway, New York, is an alarm clock that can be set to ring either loudly or softly according to need. It will alarm at any minute of the hour and at any hour out of the twelve. This accuracy is made possible by the move-

able rim around the face. The illustration shows the alarm set to ring in nine minutes. The office man can be reminded of an appointment; the commuter can catch his train, and the cook can boil eggs to exactly the right degree by aid of this alarm clock, which is as exact and as relentless in its reminding as a New England conscience. 


A SAFETY-FIRST ELECTRIC CLOTHES WASHER.—The Thor Electric Home Washing Machine No. 25, made by the Hurley Machine Company, New York and Chicago. This electric washer is warranted to overcome what had hitherto been the defects in such machines. It is provided with a protective device which automatically prevents the motor being overloaded or burned out, and its reversible 11-inch roll wringer is equipped with a safety guard. The machine itself is built on the reversing cylinder principle, the cylinder containing the clothes being revolved first in one direction and then in the other, so that the suds are flushed back and forth through the fabric, thoroughly cleansing it. Tests have proven that the machine is simple to use, requires no attention after starting and produces excellent results at a cost of 1 1/2 to 2 cents an hour for electricity. Price \$30.



A PROTECTIVE CONTAINER FOR WOOLLY AND FURRY GARMENTS.—White Tar Moth Bags, made by the White Tar Company, 103 John St., New York, seem to be the last word in preparedness against the moths and dust that corrupt the furs and woolen goods which weigh so heavily on the housewife's mind each spring. The garments may be hung up inside and the whole bag hermetically sealed against air, dust and insects. The bags are made in four sizes, ranging from 24 to 30 inches and 37 to 70 inches long, and there are four varieties, Pine Tar, Cedar, Lavender and Odorless. The prices range from 50 cents to \$2.00.
