



Glorious France Welcomes Our Brave Boys



Six German prisoners at work on the dock thoughtfully contemplate the arrival of the first U. S. troops in France. *Kadel & Herbert.*




This picture shows four of our transports unloading at a French port. How many guns can you count on their decks? *Kadel & Herbert.*


