


Raphael Kirchner, famous Austrian artist, who died a few days ago, delighted thousands last year by his clever decorations in the Coconut Grove atop the Century.


Frederic C. Howe, New York's Commissioner of Immigration, on the right, ducks out of his hot office for a day's cooling enjoyment at the shore.



Michel Jacobs, noted Washington artist, pictured above, is now lecturing on camouflage in the Officers' Training Camp at Fortress Monroe, Virginia.


