


Above is the first photograph of the Kaiser to reach this country in many months. It was taken some time last winter on the occasion of the German Emperor's visit to Rumania, and shows the war lord and his staff sadly inspecting the instruments with which represent-

atives of the Standard Oil Company destroyed the country's great oil wells on the approach of the Austro-German invaders. The mourning band on the Kaiser's withered left arm is in marked contrast to the numerous war crosses that are spread over his breast.

Probably the most unusual and dramatic aerial photograph ever taken. In a running fight at the height of nearly two miles an Allied plane disables the machine gun of a German aviatik plane, and rather than be shot down the Hun pilot and his

observer surrender. The snapshot, taken from the victorious Allied fighting machine, shows the Fritz observer in the characteristic "Kamerad!" pose of German surrender.
