
Seaman John R. Alexander, Jr., Altoona, Pa., Drowned from a scout patrol boat.

Musician James Masson, 113th Inf., Bethel, Conn. Died at Camp McClellan




Lieut. Whitney H. Joyce, Unadilla, N. Y. Killed in action.

Seaman Frederick R. Hughes, Rossville, Md. Killed on the Moldavia.




Lieut. J. L. Mitchell, Milwaukee, Wis. Killed in action.
