Aspirant Coleman Tileston Clark, 28th Regiment, F. A. (French Army), Westfield, N. J. Killed in action near Soissons.




Private Edward Conforti, Co. L, 310th Infantry, Brooklyn. Killed in action.



Robert McLeod Davis, Co. A, 107th U. S. Infantry, White Plains, N. Y. Killed in action.



Private Roland W. Judd, Co. A, 308th Infantry, New York City. Killed in battle, Argonne Forest, October 5.



Lieutenant James F. Delany, 315th Infantry, New York. Killed in action.



Corporal Rowland Westcott Waterbury, Co. L, 107th Regiment U. S. Infantry, 27th Division. Died from wounds received in action September 29.



Ensign William Edward Bingham, New York. Drowned off Morocco coast.



Private George O. S. Carr, 107th Machine Gun Battalion, New York. Died of wounds received in action.



Private A. Wallace Granath, Co. D, 165th U. S. Infantry. Killed in action July 31, 1918.



First Class Boatswain's Mate Charles Howard Cotton, U. S. N. R. F., Ossining, N. Y. Died of Spanish influenza. (Fine Art Studio, Ossining-on-Hudson.)



Ensign William Griffith Sprague, of Detroit, Mich. Won the Croix de Guerre. Died in airplane accident in France October 26, 1918.



Michael Emilio Cerreta, 111th Field Artillery, Battery A, Bridgeport, Conn. Died from wounds received in action.



Private George A. Greb, Co. M, 308th Infantry, Brooklyn. Killed in action.



Corporal Emil Cachione, Co. D, 305th Machine Gun Battalion, New York. Died of wounds received in action.



First Class Private Patrick E. McEnery, Co. E, 132d Chicago Infantry, Bridgeport, Conn. Died from wounds received in action.



Private Paul A. Gardner, Co. L, 306th Infantry, New York City. Killed in action.



Lieutenant Harry I. Duff, 305th Machine Gun Battalion, The Bronx. Killed in action.



First Lieutenant Gordon Clark Gregory, Co. G, 306th Infantry, New York. Killed in action.



Private Victor Mitchell, Co. H, 107th Regiment, New York. Killed in action.



Private Charles Claines, 305th Infantry, 77th Division. Killed in action.



Private Philip Danusky, Co. G, 312th Infantry, Newark, N. J. Killed in action.
