First Lieutenant Harold E. Kilburn, El Paso, Tex. Died in France from wounds received in action.



Lieutenant C. A. Meyer, Andover, N. J., 162d U. S. Infantry, 41st Division. Killed in action October 6, 1918.



First Lieutenant Roger Wolcott Hitchcock, New York. Distinguished Service Cross, 88th Aero Squadron, A. E. F., France. Killed in battle September 2 at Chateau Thierry.



Lieutenant Frank J. Felbel, New York City. 28th Infantry, Co. I, 1st Division. Killed in action in Argonne Forest.



First Lieutenant Herbert Arthur Buermeyer, Co. E, 9th Regiment, U. S. Infantry. Killed in France, July 2, 1918.



Lieutenant Irving J. Pinkus, U. S. Medical Officers Reserve Corps, New York. Killed in action.



Private James J. Sullivan, Battery D, 344th Field Artillery, A. E. F., New York City. Killed in action.



Private Albert J. Lobbell, jr., Co. L, 167th U. S. Infantry, Salem Center, Westchester Co. Killed in action.



Private William August Schrack, Co. L, 306th Infantry, New York. Killed in action.



Corporal James H. Gibson, 105th Infantry, New York. Killed in action October 19.



Private Edward B. Sargent, Co. L, 105th Infantry, New York. Killed in action.



Charles Frederick Hauptner, Battery B, 101st Field Artillery, 26th Division. Died in France, November 29.



Private Charles Henry Holden, Brooklyn. Died in active service on the Italian front of pneumonia.



Private Andrew Dunleavy, Co. F, 4th U. S. Infantry, New York. Killed in action.



Private Joseph T. Newman, Co. B, 165th Infantry (old 69th Regiment), New York. Killed in action July 15, 1918.



Cook Hugo Pardi, Supply Co, 311th Quartermaster Corps, New York. Killed in action.



Private Frederick E. Wildeman, Weehawken, N. J., Co. B, 9th Infantry. Killed in action.



Sergeant Earl Kocher, Co. A, 149th Machine Gun Battalion, Easton, Penn. Killed in France.



Richard Warner Van Ingen, Brooklyn. Killed in action.



Corporal Albert J. Gotti, Co. K, 307th Infantry, New Rochelle, N. Y. Killed in action.



Private Harry Leroy Kline, Tappan, N. Y., Headquarters Co., 309th Infantry. Killed in action.



Corporal John McCullough, 106th U. S. Infantry, Co. C, Brooklyn. Killed in action.



Lieutenant John Proctor Hanford, New York City, formerly Cedar Rapids, Iowa, Co. F, 166th Regiment, 42d Division (Rainbow). Killed at Chateau Thierry.



Private Carmine De Feo, 106th Infantry, 27th Division, Brooklyn. Killed in action.



Private Jeremiah Bennett Aitken, Co. H, 106th U. S. Infantry, New York. Killed in action.



Loren J. Brady, 125th Infantry, Medical Department, 32d Division, Unionville, Mich. Killed in action.



Private Leonard Seymour Davis, 56th Coast Artillery Corps, Bridgeport, Conn. Died of pneumonia on board transport April 3.
