



Left—End view of the house, showing steps leading to French doors opening into the dining room. To the left is the door that leads from the ground level into the pantry.

Side and rear view of the house, showing the cozy enclosed conservatory porch which is really a year round family playroom. Three windows of the main bedroom look out upon the roof above.

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



Right—Two of the second floor's five bedrooms open on the airy upstairs porch.


Left—The garage end of the house with 3 servants' bedrooms and bath on the second floor of this wing.
