

DEPEW PLACE





## Foreword

Since the last New York Electrical Show, America has come triumphant from the great World War, and the general trend of the times, and particularly the relation of electricity to the readjustment, is mirrored in the exhibitions. Americans, who concentrated their every thought and energy on the winning of the war, are now just as actively endeavoring to restore conditions to normal. The electrical instruments that detected submarines or aided the Signal Corps have been crowded off the stage by the appliances that simplify effort in the factory, the home and the office.

The war, of course, has left its trace, and during the temporary rather unsettled times countless problems arise. Electricity is solving many of them. As a concrete example of this we may cite an in-

stance relating to the home. Owing to the scarcity of living quarters many large apartments and old dwelling houses have been remodelled to provide a greater number of smaller suites of, in some cases, merely two or three rooms. In such limited quarters there was little room for the usual type of kitchen, and the question of preparing meals presented quite a problem until the tenants discovered that electrical cooking appliances prepare food more quickly and with less effort and fuss than the customary hot, smoky kitchen, or the stuffy kitchenette. Very little space is required, and the breakfast and luncheon are not only prepared, but served right on the table. This very practical use of grills, percolators and hot plates has the further advantage of making one more room available for the greater part of the day.

Electrical appliances eliminate that old-fashioned tug and tussle, and not only save the energy of the housewife, but release her from the breakfast-to-luncheon-to-dinner grind of cooking and washing and housework worry that reduce the hours for recreation to a minimum. In the same manner, many of the war-time uses of electricity, and some of the lessons learned about it, are now being applied to the

development of the commerce and industry of peace. The factory and office, just as did the home, learned to do more and better work with the aid of electricity.

Electricity is the emancipator, and to demonstrate the ease of application and operation is the endeavor of the New York Electrical Show of 1919.
