



You are now looking down from an aeroplane on the grand and glorious city of — Well, what's your guess? It's a station stop for trains between New York and Washington, though you have probably never gotten off there nor ever will if you judge the town by what you can see from the car windows. The stream on the right is neither the Passaic nor the Raritan, but a canal that parallels the Delaware River. 


