

**F**or playing bridge the other night, I trumped an ace, and gee (You orter seen the tiger look an old dame handed me!)




**A**nd when the missus found her notes which I forgot to mail A panther never yielded up a more blood curdling wail.




**A** spotted adder bites itself in anger so they say Well just indorse somebody's note and then be forced to pay.
