

SAGASTA CABINET ASSURES OFFICE.

Its Members Received by the Queen at the Palace and Sworn In.

PERILS THAT CONFRONT IT.

Fears of a Revolution at Madrid Before the Cuban Question Is Settled.

MORET AS COLONIAL MINISTER

As Such He Will Have the Direction of All Affairs in Connection with the Antilles.

Madrid, Oct. 4.—The new Ministry is constituted as follows: Senor Sagasta—President of the Council of Ministers.

Senor Gullon—Minister for Foreign Affairs. Senor Grolizard—Minister of Justice.

Senor Moret—Minister for the Colonies. The ministers, after an informal meeting, proceeded to the palace and took the oath of office.

There seems to be a growing impression that Senor Sagasta will not be able to settle the Cuban difficulty without being led upon to face a full-fledged revolution here.

One of the members of the new Spanish Cabinet interviewed to-day by the correspondent of one of the organs of the Madrid press, is quoted as saying that Premier Sagasta will carry out the Cuban reforms proposed by Marshal Martinez Campos ten years ago.

Continuing, the new Cabinet Minister is said to have remarked that Premier Sagasta will not consent to a customs union between the United States and Cuba, and he is said to have added that, if the former is not satisfied, Spain is prepared to fight.


