June 6, 1916.




LI YUAN-HANG,

Emperor of Japan, who
succeeded to the throne
on the death of his
father July 30, 1912.



TERAUCHI,
Premier of Japan, who came into power Oct.
9, 1916, and has staunchly supported the
Allied cause.



VAJIRAVUDH,
King of Siam, which was the
sixteenth nation to join the En-
tente against the Central Powers.



KIKUJIRO ISHII,
Japanese Ambassador to the United States,
and one of his country's delegates to the
Peace Conference.
