


Imprisonment of Ex-Czar, Last of the Romanoffs



(Above.) The house in Ekaterinburg, Russia, where the unfortunate ex-Czar of Russia spent his last days, is here seen in part, the lower part being hidden by a high board fence guarded by Bolshevik sentries to prevent approach by unauthorized persons. It was here that he was reported to have been executed in the Summer of 1918 by a decree of the Ural Soviet Government.

(At Left.) The ex-Czar is here shown in the grounds of the palace at Tsarskoe-Selo, near Petrograd, where he was imprisoned after his abdication on March 15, 1917. Later on he was transferred to Siberia, where he is said on doubtful evidence to have been executed.
