PRESIDENT WILSON'S CABLED MESSAGE TO THE AMERICAN PEOPLE:

"The treaty of peace has been signed. If it is ratified and acted upon in full and sincere execution of its terms it will furnish the charter for a new order of affairs in the world. It is a severe treaty in the duties and penalties it imposes upon Germany, but it is severe only because great wrongs done by Germany are to be righted and repaired; it imposes nothing that Germany cannot do; and she can regain her rightful standing in the world by the prompt and honorable fulfillment of its terms. And it is much more than a treaty of peace with Germany. \* \* \* It makes international law a reality supported by imperative sanction. \* \* \* It recognizes the inalienable rights of nationality, the rights of minorities and the sanctity of religious belief and practice. \* \* \* It is for this reason that I have spoken of it as a great charter for a new order of affairs. There is ground here for deep satisfaction, universal reassurance, and confident hope."

WAR FORMALLY ENDED WHEN 26 NATIONS PROVE THE DOCUMENT

PREMIER CLEMENCEAU TO FRENCH DEPUTIES:

"By France and by our allies the work of the salvation of the world from peril is accomplished, on the single condition that we remain at our posts of duty. The old spirit of warlike domination is perhaps mastered forever. The day has come when force and justice, that were redoubtably separated, must be rejoined for the peace of peoples that humanity may live. That peace we want with a will that nothing should shake. We will make that peace, as we made war, without weakness."

Bringing War to an End  
Marks Formalities at Versailles  
in Message Urges Acceptance

KING GEORGE'S ADDRESS TO THE BRITISH PEOPLE:  
"The signing of the treaty of peace will be received with deep thankfulness throughout the British Empire. This formal act brings to its concluding stages the terrible war which has devastated Europe. It manifests the victory of ideals, of freedom and of liberty for which we have made untold sacrifices. I share my people's joy and thanksgiving and earnestly pray that the coming years of peace may bring to them ever-increasing happiness and prosperity."
