

BOSTON'S SICK HEROES AT HOME. Wound Up Months of Peril with Shipwreck off Point Judith.

TAKEN TO THE HOSPITALS. Many Were Too Weak to Walk, but None Died on the Way.

Boston, Sept. 6.—One hundred and thirty-three battle-worn, camp-sick and shipwrecked soldiers, most of them of the Ninth Massachusetts Regiment, who three months ago left Massachusetts to fight for their country, arrived in this city early this morning and were distributed among the different hospitals.

They survived Spanish bullets and the fever camp at Santiago, the sufferings on the trip North on the Alleghany, the misery of the detention camp, but when they attempted to reach the Bay State they were forced last night to go through another trying experience on the steamer Lewiston, which was wrecked on Point Judith Breakwater.

The side-wheeler Lewiston was chartered by the Massachusetts Volunteer Aid Society to go to Montauk Point and bring to Boston as many of the sick Massachusetts soldiers as she could accommodate.

Dr. T. D. Shea took charge of the boat, and a detail of twenty men of the Ambulance Corps of the Massachusetts Volunteer Militia, under command of Captain Miles Standish, were on board to move the sick soldiers. A corps of five physicians were also on board the boat, together with a number of nurses.

After leaving Montauk on Monday the steamer proceeded to Montauk Point and then to Boston as many of the sick Massachusetts soldiers as she could accommodate.
