

DEUTSCHLAND TO BE A COLOSSUS.

This Immense Ocean Liner Expected to Log Twenty-four Knots.

AFTER KAISER'S LAURELS. New Hamburg Steamship Will Snatch Southampton Record.

That the huge Kaiser Wilhelm der Grosse of the North German Lloyd, represented nearly the limit of size that could enter this port was generally conceded when that immense vessel arrived here on her maiden voyage. But large ships than the Kaiser and possessed of more powerful engines are now being built.

One of them is of course the White Star Leviathan, Oceanic, now in course of construction at Belfast. But another vessel of which little is known thus far, is the Deutschland, which is building for the Hamburg American Line at the Stettin Iron Works. Emil Boss, general manager of the line in this port, who returned on the Kaiser last Friday night from a six weeks' stay abroad, said the new steamer was intended as a record-breaker and from his description of the craft, there is little doubt that the Deutschland's special mission is to snatch the Southampton record from the North German Lloyd.

The Deutschland will be 685 feet long or 37 feet longer than the Kaiser. She will have a beam of 68 feet, two feet more than the North German Lloyd prize, and she will have a depth of 35 feet, or six feet deeper than the Kaiser.

It is well to remark here that the German ships, in spite of their great length, are not as deep as the smaller, though proportionately fleet, American liners. The St. Paul and St. Louis, for example, are both fifty feet deep, and they had the length of the German vessels. It is doubtful if they could cross Sandy Hook bar.

Engines Balanced Like a Watch. The Deutschland is to have two sets of quadruple expansion engines of 84,000 horse power driving twin screws. They will exceed by 4,000 horse power the engines that now propel the Kaiser.

They will be built on the Schlick system. Every motion of the great system of machinery will be so carefully counterbalanced that there will be practically no vibration. This question of preventing vibration has been the aim for years of ship builders and of marine engine builders. They knew that vibration lessened the propelling power of the machinery and in proportion to the amount of vibration the speed increased. Hence it was that expert engineers watched the work of the Kaiser's engines with such interest. They are on the Schlick system, and are carefully balanced as a watch.

It was because of this remarkable system of preventing vibration by means of counter motions, so that the two motions were neutralized—met in the middle and stopped there, as one engineer put it—that the Kaiser was able to make such remarkable speed when her machinery was new. There were no bearings to be worn down smooth. They had been turned smooth to start with and adjusted to the finest possible fraction.

Mr. Boss says Mr. Boss will be the machinery of the Deutschland, and with her finely modeled hull—built on the lines of a yacht—she is expected to make 24 to 25 knots a day. The Kaiser has made twenty-three, but she has never averaged that rate. The Deutschland is expected to make 24 in a day, and her builders look for an even greater speed in smooth water.

The vessel will have a single steel skin, but will have a double bottom for water ballast and also a longitudinal bulkhead, which will divide the engine room. Her passenger accommodations are to exceed in elaborateness anything heretofore attempted. The staterooms of the saloon passengers will have every appointment to be found in the rooms of first-class hotels.

Will Have a Grill Room. There will also be a grill room, where saloon passengers may have a meal at short notice at any hour of the day or night. The grill room is in the nature of an innovation. The establishment of one aboard a passenger liner has never been tried before.

Another contemplated feature of the new vessel is a children's play room. Speaking of this feature Mr. Boss said: "Such a feature is one which will be well received by the travelling public. It will be a relief to the mothers to know that their children are out of harm's way, and that they are being constantly watched. This room will be supplied with toys for children of all ages, and will also have something of the nature of a kindergarten of a larger growth can be amused in it. It will be in charge of a stewardess in whose care the children will be as long as they are in this room. They will be as safe there as they would be in their nurseries at home."

The Deutschland is expected to accommodate 420 saloon, 300 second cabin and 800 stateroom passengers. She will be launched early in 1899 and will start on her maiden trip in April of that year. She is by no means the only ship the Hamburg Line is building. The line is now constructing twelve passenger and freight steamships for their various services. One to be 600 feet long is taking form at Hamburg, in the yards of Blohm & Voess. At Tecklenburg another is to be built and others will grow in English ship yards.

The Holland-American Line, once known as the Netherlands-American line, has also contracted for a new passenger steamer, though but little is known about it now.
