

which had passed the Legislature of 1898, which were desired by certain corporate interests, and whose approval Senator Platt had assumed to deliver by promising it in advance for valuable financial assistance rendered and to be rendered, furnished the sole reason for his recent desertion of the Governor. If this be the "true inwardness" of the hostility, then the action of Governor Black was alike creditable to his integrity and independence.

This explanation does not seem to be sincere nor adequate. The friends of Governor Black reply that the officials most largely responsible for the canal frauds are the State Engineer and the Superintendent of Public Works, the first of whom was nominated in party convention at the instance of Senator Platt, and the latter of whom was inherited by Governor Black from his immediate Republican predecessor, and both were creatures of the State machine, for whom the whole party was responsible.

But it is said with much apparent satisfaction that the excise revenues have been increased. That is true, and is inevitable under the alleged exorbitant fees charged, and if pecuniary considerations are alone to be consulted there may be some occasion for congratulation. But in the framing of a just and equitable excise law such considerations should not be paramount, an excise law should have something else to commend it besides its revenue producing qualities.

The liquor tariff was comparatively harmless when its supervision was distributed to the various local officers throughout the State, some Democratic and some Republican, selected by the people themselves in their respective towns and cities; but it becomes dangerous when it is all concentrated under the control and brought under the influence of a single State department, having at its disposal vast patronage and at its command a horde of "confidential" agents to do its bidding.
