2 KILLED, 23 HURT, TELEGRAMS FROM SHORE TO SHIP.

One Hundred Buildings in the Neighborhood Damaged. Marconi Called Up a War Vessel in the Channel from the South Foreland.

Philadelphia, April 25.—By the explosion of seventy-five gallons of benzol in the laboratory of Frank H. Fler & Co., manufacturers of chewing gum, at Nos. 2343 and 2345 Calowhill street, to-day, Walter Mauwaring, assistant superintendent, and Charles McKinley, engineer, were killed, and Harry Randall, an employe, and Mrs. Givison and her one-year-old child were seriously injured.

LONDON, April 26, 1 a. m.—Marconi conducted experiments yesterday in wireless telegraphy from the South Foreland to the French gunboat Isis, in mid-channel.

Bombay, April 25.—The Times of India says it learns from an "unimpeachable source" that Russia has secured an interest on the Persian Gulf sufficient to give her the right to take possession of it whenever she chooses.

CHILD SAVER AND BLISS AS A GOOD MAN FOR MAYOR.

Father Was the Murderer and Tried also to Kill Her. SHE NARROWLY ESCAPED.

Imprint of the Mad Man's Fingers Was Left on Her White Night Dress.

Camden, N. J., April 25.—Edward Oswald murdered his wife and child this morning, tried to kill his eldest daughter, and, when arrested, slashed his own throat and may die.

The children were Guselle Belle, six years old, and Edna May, eight years old.

The only witness to the crime is the eight-year-old girl Edna, whose agility saved her life. She says, and this part is corroborated by other witnesses, that she and her two children spent the evening with Mrs. Roosevelt, a sister of Mrs. Oswald, going home at a late hour.

Within an hour after the children retired the tragedy began. Edna says she was awakened by her father moving about and saw him approach the mother's bed with a knife. With this he tried to cut her, but she escaped.

Edna was trying to get out, and had unlocked the door when Oswald ran to her, seized her, and plunged the knife into her breast. Death must have come instantly.

Oswald is said to have followed the child out of the house, but on seeing the wagon and the police ran back into the room where the bodies of the woman and child lay.

TROOPS FROM ALASKA TO THE PHILIPPINES. Reinforcements for Otis From There, From Porto Rico and From the Western States.

Washington, April 25.—Major-General Otis must have more troops in the Philippines, or he must confine his operations to a comparatively small zone about the city of Manila. This view of the situation was accepted by the Cabinet and the President to-day, and orders were signed transferring the Nineteenth Infantry, now in Porto Rico, to the Philippines.

A plan to send the four regiments of negro Troops—Ninth and Tenth Cavalry and the Twenty-fourth and Twenty-fifth Infantry—is under consideration by the War Department, and will probably be adopted.
