His Sister's Devotion Leads to His Release from Crow Hill.

PRESIDENT PARDONS HIM.

Thirty Minutes After the Receipt of the Document He Leaves the Penitentiary.

WILL RETURN TO LITTLE ROCK.

Old Friends of the Former Bank President Will Hold a Big Reception for Him When He Reaches Home.

Horace G. Allis, at one time president of the First National Bank in Little Rock, Ark., walked out of the Kings County Penitentiary, Brooklyn, yesterday, a free man. He was pardoned by President McKinley.

As in the case of Carter, the bank cashier, who was pardoned two weeks ago, Allis's release is due mainly to a woman's devotion. In this case it was the prisoner's sister, Lulu, who pleaded with the Executive for his release. It is said, moreover, that all the prominent club men, city officials and every taxpayer of Little Rock, Ark., signed the petition for Allis's pardon, and his case attracted the attention and sympathy of many prominent men in the State as well.

Allis's conviction and sentence is a strange one. The First National Bank of Little Rock was looked upon as one of the soundest in the State. Its president was considered the state of honor and a fine financier. In 1893 and 1894 the bank lost heavily through unfortunate investments. Just prior to the annual visit of the Government bank examiners, in the summer of 1894, President Allis came to New York to negotiate a loan to tide the bank over its temporary difficulty. He had good security to offer, and secured the promise of what money he required. Allis telegraphed his cashier of his success.

The shortages found by the bank examiners were charged against the loan in New York, and a clean bill of health was given to the bank.

Allis reached home in due time, but the money did not come. The New York bankers who promised to help him wired him of a change in their plans, and the money was withheld. The bank went to pieces with a crash, but Allis and other directors turned in their private fortunes and made good the losses. This made no difference. The president was arrested for violating the banking laws, for charging up the money in New York which he thought he had, but which was not to be had upon the Government's account.

The situation, technical violation of the law, Walter H. Sanborn, a prominent banker, advised him to go to the Kings County Penitentiary at the prison, and he was there for five months.

Sanborn spent most of her time in Washington, D. C., and from there, setting forth the facts above stated, it is believed that she failed to act. When she heard of the case he was pardoned. LOCOMOTIVE STRUCK HIM. Mendal Kipman Instantly Killed by a Rockaway Beach Train.

Mendal Kipman, of No. 80 Siegel street, Brooklyn, was struck and killed by a Rockaway Beach train at the Penny Bridge crossing of the Long Island Railroad yesterday morning. He was walking on the track and paid no attention to the whistle. The engineer tried to stop the train, but it struck the man before coming to a standstill. The body was removed to Darren's Morgue, Long Island City. In one vest pocket were found a small gold watch and chain. They were the only articles found on the body. He was not identified until late in the afternoon. He was employed as a tinsmith in Haberman's tinware factory, near where he was killed.

OBEY A COURT OR GO TO JAIL. Long Island City Police Board Compelled to Restore Kavanagh to the Force.

Policeman Owen J. Kavanagh, of Long Island City, was restored to duty yesterday. The Police Commissioners had their notice of reinstatement of Kavanagh to the force by the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court, but ignored the order. Kavanagh's counsel took the matter before the court, and the Commissioners were ordered to restore Kavanagh to duty forthwith or go to jail.

Kavanagh is a veteran of the war, and was dismissed by the Police Board by discharge of Mayor Gibson, who had a grudge against him.

FLYING ENGINE HIT HIM.

Raynor Was Hurl'd Fifty Feet Away and Instantly Killed, but His Companion Escaped.

John A. Raynor, formerly a hotel keeper at Patchogue, L. I., was instantly killed yesterday by a Long Island Railroad train at the Central avenue crossing in Chaucery street, Williamsburg. The train which struck him was No. 938, in charge of Engineer John Selz and Conductor George Buckel. It left Manhattan Beach for Long Island City at 1:30 p. m., and twenty-three minutes later the fatal accident occurred.

Raynor was fifty years old, and lately had lived with his wife at No. 967 Belmont street, Brooklyn. In the company of John Selz and Conductor George Buckel, he went yesterday to East New York on business. On their return they walked about the crossing at Chaucery street, and saw a train approaching from Long Island City, and stepped from the track on which it was coming. They were struck by the train which hit him and he was hurled about fifty feet.

Selz claims to have the whistle and rang the bell with all his might. Just before Raynor was struck Henderson discovered that there was a train behind him, and he about to lay out of the way. Henderson hurried from the track, but Raynor, it is thought, became paralyzed with terror and could not get out of the way. The train struck him and he was hurled about fifty feet.

The train was brought to a stop about 100 yards from where the accident happened. When a search was made for Henderson it was found he had disappeared. He is believed to have been hurled into the water by the train, and it is thought that the police found it difficult to obtain an intelligent account of the affair from Henderson's body was taken to the Hamburg Avenue Police Station and later on an order from Coroner Nason taken to an undertaker's. ANDREWS IN A NEW ROLE.

Former Anti-Greater New York Lecturer Is Now the Defendant in a Suit for Divorce.

Roger F. M. Andrews is the defendant in a suit for absolute divorce, in the Supreme Court in Brooklyn. Andrews is the editor of the Johnstown, Pa., Daily Democrat. He is well known in Brooklyn. In 1892 and 1893 he was identified with the Brooklyn anti-consumptionists, of which William C. Redfield, A. A. Low, and others were the moving spirits. Andrews was business manager of the organ of the anti-consumptionists, party of the "Greater Brooklyn." He was a frequent talker, and gave lectures with great effect. He accompanied to show the beauties of Brooklyn, and the disadvantages of the city uniting with New York. He was also a frequent lecturer on the difference in the tax rates on the roof of the building, corner Cort and Joralemon streets, one night, when he was arrested at the investigation of Anthony J. Constock. Constock did not object to the pictures he was showing at the time, but he asserted that Andrews had been convicted with a charge of living in Johnstown, Pa., and was suppressed in Brooklyn. Andrews was acquitted on this charge.

While in Brooklyn, Andrews married Alice Hamilton, a daughter of the late C. Hamilton, a prominent Brooklynite. The ceremony took place on September 4, 1893, and was quite a social event in the city of Johnstown. Andrews had outlived his usefulness. Andrews went to Johnstown, taking his wife and their little boy. He was living in Johnstown, Pa., and the family trouble started. Mrs. Andrews, of Chicago, Ill., is named as co-respondent.

CHANEY GOES MAD AGAIN.

The Federal Prisoner Will Be Taken to an Asylum for the Fourth Time in a Year and a Half.

Alfred Chaney, another insane prisoner at Crow Hill, will be taken to the asylum at Washington, D. C., to-day. This is the fourth time he has been taken there for treatment. Each time previously he has been apparently cured in a month. Delay in securing a pardon is believed to be the cause of Chaney's madness. Chaney was arrested in Indian Territory for robbing a train in company with "Kid" Wilson and other desperadoes. He is what is known as a "square" man, having an Indian woman and lived with her tribe. He declares he was at his home, nine miles from the scene of the hold-up, the night it occurred. He says his brother was in the band of robbers, and that he was convicted instead of his brother. Wilson and the other members of the band who are serving in the penitentiary unite in saying that Chaney is innocent. Charities Commissioner Borris and Chaplain Bass have long been interested in Chaney. He is not guilty, and they have joined with other Brooklynites in an effort to have him pardoned. Chaney's application was denied by President Cleveland and the man's friends went to President McKinley, but a few days ago an adverse report was received. Chaney is a man of unusual dependability, and has developed a suicidal mania. He has to be carefully watched to prevent him killing himself. He has served a year and a half of a four-year sentence.

GRAVE CHARGES FOR M'LEE.

Accused of Manlaughter for Starving One of His Children to Death. He Had \$350.

Philip McLee, of Long Island City, who turned his family into the street, was arraigned in the police court before Justice Duffy, yesterday. McLee's infant child died on Sunday, and he had to face a charge of manlaughter in the second degree. He was committed to jail without bail to await the result of the Coroner's inquest. Mrs. McLee was present in court. She left the baby at her home, at No. 173 West 10th street, on Sunday. Her husband returned from work. When McLee discovered the baby he ordered his daughter to remove it from the home. She took the child to a neighbor's. The baby was ill and taken to St. John's Hospital, but they refused to receive it. McLee and his wife were taken to the hospital and arranged to have the dead baby buried. She found \$350 in the house. She has been mostly refused to buy food for the family.

MRS. PECK WENT CONTEST.

She Withdraws Her Action Against the Will of her Former Husband, G. W. Watkins.

Ann Augusta Peck, of Norwalk, Conn., filed objections on July 22 with Surrogate Petty, to the will of George W. Watkins, a wealthy resident of Amityville, on the ground that she was his widow. The first hearing was set down for yesterday. Watkins died at Amityville on May 16, leaving an estate valued at \$25,000. Mrs. Peck, the contestant, admits that she has not lived with Watkins for more than forty years, having procured a divorce and afterward remarried. She claimed the will was not the last testament of Watkins; that he was mentally incapacitated and that undue influence was used. The bulk of the estate is personal property. It is divided into three parts, a minor, and a son of Jason Hart, of Amityville, who was a friend of Watkins. When the case was called yesterday in Surrogate Petty's court, the contest was withdrawn. The will will be admitted to probate.

Ran a Pitechfork Through His Ear.

PRISONER MET BY TWO WIVES.

Spear's Duplicity Disclosed by Them in a Police Station.

FATHER OF NO. 1 VIOLENT.

Had to Be Held by Two Policemen to Prevent Him from Attacking the Prisoner.

Herbert E. Spear, thirty years old, employed as a conductor by the Brooklyn Heights Railroad Company, was a prisoner last night in the Bedford Avenue Police Station, Williamsburg. He was arrested in the afternoon by Policeman Short, who saw him coming out of his house at No. 108 Havermeier street, Williamsburg. Spear is known also as Anderson, Larsen and Isaac Spero. In the latter part of February Spear abandoned his wife and two little children. The family after the desertion lived in South Brooklyn. Mrs. Spero searched in vain for her husband for nearly a month, and returned with her children to her parents' home, at No. 287 Twentieth street. She continued the search for Spear, however, and in the meantime the Charities Commissioners had issued a warrant for abandonment against Spero.

About ten days ago Mrs. Spear was informed that her husband was employed on the North Beach branch of the Brooklyn Heights Railroad. She made inquiries and discovered that he lived at No. 108 Havermeier street with another woman, who claimed to be his wife. Mrs. Spear communicated with Policeman Short, who had the warrant against the fugitive, and it was arranged that she with her elder child and her parents should meet him yesterday afternoon at the Bedford Avenue Station. They were on hand, and while Mrs. Spear with the child and her mother waited at the station Short and Mrs. Spear's father went to look for Spear.

Late in the afternoon Spear was seen to leave the house and run after a Grand Street trolley car. Mrs. Spear's father told Short who the runner was, and the policeman started in pursuit. Spear saw them coming and tried to get the conductor to increase the speed of the car. When Short reached the car Spear jumped over the seats to get away. He was captured, however, after a lively chase and taken to the station house.

When he was confronted by his wife he repudiated her and declared that he had never seen her before. Mrs. Spear's father had to be held by a policeman to keep him from attacking the prisoner. Spear edged toward a policeman, still declaring that he didn't know the woman. Then his father-in-law picked up the little three-year-old boy and held him up before the prisoner. "Do you mean to say," shouted the father-in-law, "that this boy isn't your child?" Spear didn't reply, and the question was put to him again. He evaded it. While the excitement was going on in the station house, several excited men wanted to know what the trouble was all about. Spear tried to tell her that it was all a mistake. She said Spear had married a woman, and that she gave her to understand he was unmarried. Spear was locked up, and will be arraigned in the Court of Sessions to-day. The police say he has two more wives.

ITS PIPES ASSESSED.

The East Jersey Water Company May Also Have to Pay Taxes on Its Reservoirs.

The East Jersey Water Company has shown on many occasions that it controls New Jersey water supplies and controls municipal boards with which it has to deal, but it was not known to the Board of Assessors of Paterson until yesterday that it does not pay a dollar of taxes on its miles of pipe line and great water storage reservoirs in Passaic County. The city of Paterson has frequently complained that it pays more than its just share of the county tax, and President Colfar made an investigation into the taxing methods of Passaic and the townships. At the meeting of the County Board yesterday he said that Paterson taxed the Passaic Water Company for its reservoirs and pipe lines, and demanded to know why the East Jersey Water Company was not taxed. Its property in Passaic County is worth at least half a million dollars. The township assessors of Passaic County were able to get the property really taxed to Newark, and could not be taxed.

SPERS GETS 29 DAYS.

Would-Be Suicide Sentenced for Attempting to Jump from a Bridge Car.

Justice Brenner, of the Adams Street Police Court, Brooklyn, yesterday sent William J. Spiers, of No. 237 East Forty-sixth street, New York, to the Penitentiary for twenty-nine days for attempting suicide. Spiers boarded a train at the New York terminal of the Bridge on Saturday night, and when the train reached the centre of the span he tried to jump over the gates. He fought with Conductor Murphy and fell into the water. He was rescued, but as his life was in danger he was taken to the hospital. Spiers said yesterday his suicidal impulse came on him suddenly. He had been drinking, and in his right mind he had no idea of suicide. He has a wife and several small children in New York.

VERMONT SET CONEY WILD.

William M. Demarest, who is said to be a prominent horse breeder at Rutland, Vt., struck Coney Island on a late train Sunday night, and at once set about to see the sights.
