

CROKER TO BE MET BY TAMMANY BRAVES.

Tammanyites Anxious to Get His Ear, on the St. Louis' Arrival.

He Can Be the Leader Without Opposition if He Will Take the Place.

But if Not It Must Be Sheehan, Say Most of the Executive Committee.

EX-REGISTER REILLY IS OPPOSED.

Declares that Tammany is Not in the Most Excellent Condition, and that Croker is Imperatively Needed.

Richard Croker is a passenger on the American liner St. Louis, which was expected to arrive from Southampton yesterday, but which had not been reported at a late hour.

It is expected that St. Louis will arrive some time this morning, and while there is to be no formal reception, it is expected that Croker's return will be a great event.

The great question involved in Mr. Croker's return relates to his future attitude toward and position in Tammany Hall.

With nearly every wealthy member of the organization dissenting from the action of the Chicago Convention, Mr. Sheehan's friends are looking to him to great credit for firmness and sagacity.

Mr. Sheehan's administration of the affairs of Tammany Hall has made many substantial friends among the leaders, most of whom on Thursday testified their appreciation of his services by presenting to him a handsome album.

Mr. Sheehan has been objected to by a few leaders on the ground that he did not give loyal support to the Democratic National ticket.

Should Mr. Croker decide again to take an official position in Tammany Hall, there will be none to say him nay.

Mr. Sheehan's friends are Mr. Croker's friends, it would seem, and there is no doubt that Mr. Sheehan would relinquish the reins of leadership to Mr. Croker should the latter indicate his desire to resume his former functions.

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Croker and the admiration I have for him are facts well known.

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BACK TO PRISON LIFE. Tobin Couldn't Keep Away from New York and Fell Again into the Clutches of the Law.

Thomas Tobin, alias 'Terney,' O'Neill and Thompson, a burglar and sneak thief with a long record, who escaped from Sing Sing Prison on June 18, 1892, was captured late Thursday night by Detectives McManus and Dorrain, of Captain O'Brien's staff.

State Detective Jackson has been on the lookout for the escaped prisoner since 1892. Tobin was serving a seven and a half years sentence for robbery. A sewer was being dug in the prison yard for the river.

Detectives Dorrain and McManus received information Thursday afternoon that Tobin was at Lexington street, near Forty-fourth street. They loitered about that neighborhood for four hours before Tobin was seen.

Tobin told Captain O'Brien that he had been all over the country since his escape, and among other things had served eighteen months for carrying a Chicago and a short time in the Indiana State Prison.

It couldn't keep away from New York, he said, he had to come back and see the sights and my old pals, and I have been pinched. The hardened criminal begged his face, but the police would not let him go.
