


ESTATE TO WHICH VINCENT ASTOR WILL TAKE HIS BRIDE




THE BREAKFAST ROOM.




VIEW FROM THE FRONT.


There is nothing showy about the house's exterior or the grounds. Everywhere the prevailing note is one of solid comfort and dignified spaciousness.
