KAISER HITS ENGLAND BY HONOR TO HOLLAND.

For Queen Wilhelmina, His Guest at Berlin, Wilhelm II. Will Make a Striking Demonstration of His Sympathy for the Boers.

It is said that it was Queen Wilhelmina's intention at first to proceed directly to the Castle at Wied, where she is to act as godmother to the firstborn son of the hereditary Prince Maximilian von Wied. The acute state of the Transvaal, however, has caused her to change her plans and pay a visit to the Kaiser, in the Potsdam palace, where she hopes to induce him to use his influence to prevent the impending war in South Africa.

BRITAIN WORKING HARD FOR PEACE.

QUEEN'S ABDICATIVE STORY IS DENIED.

London, Oct. 6.—In connection with the rumors that Queen Victoria is likely to intervene to prevent war, a curious story is published this morning by the Vienna Extrablatt, which says that Her Majesty intends to abdicate in the event of an outbreak of hostilities, declaring that it has this information from an "excellent source."

Johannesburg, Oct. 6.—The Government is sending thousands of Kaffir miners from the Rand into the northern districts of the Transvaal to avoid danger of a collision with the whites in the event of war.

WILL NOT RECEIVE GENERAL O'BEIRNE

Washington, Oct. 6.—General James R. O'Beirne, of New York will not be acknowledged by the United States Government as Commissioner extraordinary of the South African Republic. He will not be received by the State Department in any diplomatic capacity representing the Transvaal.
