The following letter has been addressed by Clarence H. Mackay, president of the Commercial Cable Company, to the Secretary of War, in relation to the application of the company to lay a second cable from the United States to Havana: Hon. Elihu Root, Secretary of War, Washington, D. C.

Washington, Oct. 13.—Officers of the marines and sailors have suffered by the so-called "official reports" from General Otis. They say there ought to be an investigation, not to prove the facts of the case, but to determine whether or not General Otis, who sees all the dispatches, is acting with premeditated malice.
