

ACAS STATE AD DOCTORS TAKE DRUGS.

Action Taken by the State Medical Association. Assertion That Ten Per Cent of Physicians Have the Habit.

The New York State Medical Association, in session yesterday at the Academy of Medicine in West Forty-third street, adopted a resolution asking the State to establish a sanitarium for incurable cases of consumption.

In a paper, to which every member of the association has read with intense interest, Dr. George W. Galer, of Monroe County, urged the necessity of State aid in the treatment of pulmonary tuberculosis, saying that consumption was more insidiously dangerous than insanity or epilepsy, and greater in the number of cases.

Dr. Galer said: "The cost of this enormous amount of preventable disease is considerable. Taking the reported deaths from consumption at 13,000, and assuming that one-half of those persons would have had an earning power of but \$200 during life, the sum would amount to \$1,300,000. And the expense of caring for the sick at but \$200 each, would be \$2,600,000. If but 1,000 families received assistance from various charities of but \$100 each, the sum would be \$100,000."

Dr. Galer said that consumption was largely a disease of city life. He said, however, that it had proved to be both preventable and a communicable disease. At the lowest authoritative estimate it is curable in 22 per cent of cases.

After a discussion the resolution asking for State aid in the treatment of consumption was adopted by a vote of 100 to 10. Dr. T. D. Crothers, of Hartford, Conn., in the beginning of his paper on "Morphinism Among Physicians," said: "In a general history of 3,244 physicians residing in the Eastern, Middle and some of the cities of the Western States, 21 per cent were found to be addicted to the use of opium."
