

ER BRIDGE HANG CAR LINES 'KIDS' FROM 41, JOB LINES Plans and Specifications for the Four Cables Made Public, COST ABOUT \$1,000,000 Contractors Must Pay Union Wages for Not More Than Eight-Hour Days.

Chief Engineer L. L. Buck made public yesterday the plans and specifications for the steel cables, suspenders, cable bands, etc., of the new East River bridge.

When all the permanent bands are in place the cables are to be covered with overlapping steel plates, so as to shed water. The wire for the cables and for the suspenders and ties must have an ultimate strength of 200,000 pounds or more to the square inch, and must have an elongation under test of at least 2 1/2 per cent in five feet of observed length and at least 2 per cent in eight inches of observed length.

The successful bidder must agree that no laborer, workman or mechanic by whomsoever employed in the performance of this contract shall be permitted or required to work more than eight hours in any one calendar day, except in cases of extraordinary emergency.

Each bidder must deposit with his proposal a certified check for \$12,000, payable to the order of the Treasurer of the Bridge Commission, and the successful bidder must give a bond in the same amount.

"MOONSHINERS" RAPE AND MURDER SKIRTS ARRESTED, Two Women Caught in an Illicit Distillery in Jersey.
