





During Much of This Time She Acted as Mayor of Both Villages, at the Same Time Hiding Wounded French Soldiers in the Cellar of Her House and Enabling Them to Escape, Always at the Risk of Her Life. When the Germans Retreated, She Was Carried Away as a Hostage, But Made Her Escape. She Is Here Shown Listening to the Order of the Day, Read by the French Colonel, Expressing the Government's Appreciation of Her Services and Bravery and Announcing the Award of the Cross of War.
