

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VENICE'S MUCH-TRAVELED HORSES, HEAVILY PADDED, ABOUT TO START BACK TO VENICE FROM ROME. War Horses, They Have Ever Been the Spoils of War, Having Been Brought from Chios to Rome at an Early Period, Later Carried to Byzantium by Constantine, Captured by the Venetians and Brought from Constantinople to Venice in 1204. Carried to Paris by Napoleon in 1797, from Paris to Venice in 1815, from Venice to Rome in 1915, and Rome to Venice 1919.


