

SEEK PARDON FOR YOUNG OFFICER

Relatives Ask Release of Lieutenant Pendleton from Philippine Prison.

CONVICTED OF MURDER

Shot Native Policeman While on Gay Ride with Several Filipino Friends.

Efforts are being made by the relatives and friends of Lieutenant Charles M. Pendleton, of the Philippine constabulary, to have him released from the sentence of twenty years in the penitentiary imposed by the Philippine Court of the First Instance for the killing of a local policeman at Cebu. The matter is entirely without the jurisdiction of the War Department, coming wholly under the civil government of the islands. The Bureau of Insular Affairs has, however, received some information regarding the incident and the following trial and they are that the young man was in bad physical condition, being delirious from fever. He took a ride in a car with several native friends on Thanksgiving evening last. The evidence at the trial did not develop just what happened, but one fact was made certain and that was that a native policeman was shot dead. The evidence on this point was very indefinite to the extent that the native witnesses could not agree as to whether the policeman stopped the carriage because it was running without lights or whether he had been summoned from the curb by Pendleton and shot without any provocation.

At the trial Pendleton was found guilty and sentenced to twenty years at hard labor in the Philippine penitentiary. A white man this is practically a death sentence. He appealed from the decision of the court, and his appeal is now pending before the Supreme Court of the archipelago. Should he fail in this appeal he will have the right of a second appeal to the Supreme Court of the United States.

His defense was that he believed himself to be attacked by a bolonang, and that he followed his instinct, cultivated by his service in the army, in shooting before the other could attack him. This was held by an American judge who had been only two months before appointed to the islands, and so far as can be learned there is no charge of undue prejudice by the court. It is believed by Lieutenant Pendleton's parents, Mr. and Mrs. William M. Pendleton, No. 229 West 114th street, New York city, that the terrible exposure and danger to which their son had been subjected for five years in the Philippines, and the treachery has forced him to resort to the too quick use of his weapon on the night the policeman was slain.

Young Pendleton comes from a distinguished family, and has many highly respected relatives in many States of the Union.

At sixteen years of age he was captain of the Georgia Military Institute, and drilled the entire battalion every day. At that age also he was first sergeant in the Fifth Georgia regiment, S. A. G., and was awarded the fifty dollar gold medal for being "the best all around soldier" in a regiment of 1,200 men.

After entering Santiago with Shafter's army and serving through to the end, Lieutenant Pendleton was resting at Atlanta, his former home and birthplace. At this time volunteers were being asked for in Atlanta for the Twenty-ninth United States Volunteers for service in the Philippines. Lieutenant Pendleton was the first man, absolutely to enlist as a private under Colonel Harden, being quickly raised to the rank of a second lieutenant on account of his Cuban record. His service in the Philippines was of a perilous character. On the day that General Henry W. Lawton was shot dead by a Filipino picket he was near him and swam the river there in pursuit of the insurgents. When the Twenty-ninth was ordered home to be mustered out young Pendleton, at the instance of Governor Taft, was offered a first lieutenancy in the regular army by President McKinley. He chose, however, to remain in the Philippines as a volunteer, desiring to see the islands completely subjected to American authority.

His election as first lieutenant in the Philippine Constabulary followed, and for six years his career has been one of unflinching bravery and heroism under the American flag. During the St. Louis World's Fair Lieutenant Pendleton was chosen to bring a crack company of constabulary for the Philippine village at the Fair. Military experts agreed that a finer trained body of men was never on exhibition.

The witness against Lieutenant Pendleton were all of native origin and the evidence relates to facts which occurred in the darkness and after the dissipation of a holiday. When the killing occurred Lieutenant Pendleton had been examined for a captaincy, no other officer having served so long or so valiantly in the wilds of the Philippines.

To show public opinion in the islands at the time of the affair, excerpts from two Manila papers are reproduced. The first is from the Manila Sun:—

"It would be well not to be too hasty in entering judgment against Lieutenant Pendleton, the constabulary officer who, it is charged, wantonly murdered a native policeman at Cebu last week. It is well

to bear in mind that Pendleton's accusers are natives, and we who have lived in the islands since the beginning of American rule know full well what this means.

"Pendleton was in an intoxicated condition during the whole night on which the murder was committed, and by many the theory is advanced that the natives in accusing him of the foul deed did so with the hope that his condition would make their story more plausible."

"The second excerpt is from the Manila Daily Times:—

"The arrest of Lieutenant Pendleton, accused of the murder of a native policeman, overshadowed the elections in point of interest in this pueblo. The defence is sanguine that Lieutenant Pendleton will be acquitted, and the American community has subscribed liberally in his defence.

"Those who say that Pendleton is innocent base their theory on the report of the surgeon who made the post-mortem examination of the body. This was to the effect that the story of the men who say that Pendleton did the shooting will not hold water, since the surgeon declares that the victim was dead some hours before the crime is alleged to have been committed."


